Cleaning Up

As the weather has gotten warmer, and we're transitioning from snow removal to landscaping, we have noticed that some people are leaving items in common areas that don't belong there.

The only item that may be stored outside your shed is a grill; all other items must be stored inside your unit or inside your storage shed.

This includes cigarette butt containers—these may *not* be stored in entryways.

We also understand that some residents have become accustomed to keeping things outside, perhaps decorations that they feel enhance the area. And perhaps

some neighbors do not mind such decorations.

The problem is, this is a condominium association, and rules are required to prevent common areas from being taken over by individuals. Therefore, we must enforce the common area rules. Please remove your belongings before they are taken.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL OWNERS:

All owners recently received a mailing announcing a Special Meeting on May 3, 2014, at 11:00 a.m. in the Clubhouse, to vote on a proposed amendment to the Springbrook Bylaws.

The Board feels this is very important. The current Bylaw language prevents Springbrook from obtaining FHA certification, because it places the Association as a third party in control of the selling or leasing of a unit.

Obtaining FHA certification would allow potential homebuyers pursuing financing through the FHA to purchase a Springbrook condominium. Obtaining this FHA certification would broaden the potential buyer base, thus positively affecting property values.

96 units must vote in favor to pass this amendment. If you wish to vote in favor, you may either ...

- \Rightarrow Attend the meeting on May 3.
- ⇒ Vote via the proxy (by mail)—but we MUST have the proxy in time for the meeting.
